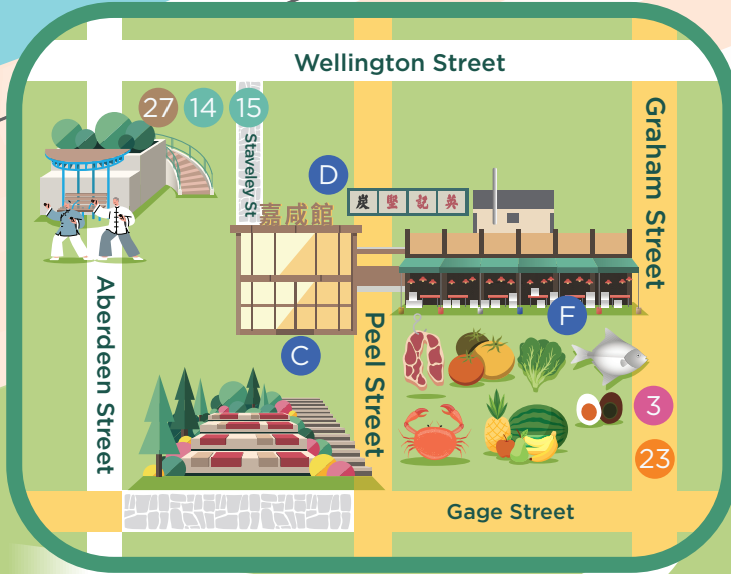

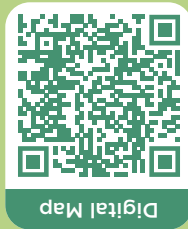
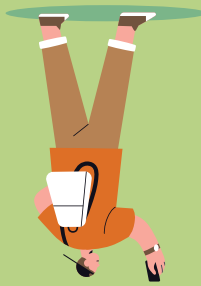

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Heritage Footprint

*URA Redevelopment Project # Historical Signboard

- A H6 CONET***
G/F, The Center, 99 Queen's Road Central
Community space connects neighbourhoods, hosts local events and activities.

Urban Renewal Exploration Centre*

Presents urban renewal strategies, processes, and future blueprint to registered participants.

- B Central Market***
93 Queen's Road Central & 80 Des Voeux Road Central
Built 1939 in Streamline Moderne style with grand terrazzo staircases at both entrances.

- C 嘉咸館 (Chinese Only)***
23 Peel Street
A multi-purpose venue offering diverse activity spaces suitable for arts and cultural, community events, and sports recreation; with a public resting area at the front.

- D Ying Kee Hard Coal****
21 Peel Street
Over 70-year-old pre-war shop with terrazzo signboard, formerly a hard charcoal specialist, later converted to banquet supplies and incense sales.

- E 120 Wellington Street***
(Coming Soon)
Built pre-1894 plague, Hong Kong's only surviving first-generation tenement building, former Wing Wo Ho grocery.

- F Graham Market***
Century-old open-air market with hawker stalls for fresh produce and groceries.

- G 26A-C Graham Street***
(Coming Soon)
Pre-war tenement buildings with unique height changes, revitalizing with original facade retained.

- H Nam Wah Ink Company****
(Coming Soon)
Arcade sign hand-inscribed by Tung Meng Hui member and Lingnan calligrapher Su Shijie.

- I Pak Tsz Lane***
Intersection of Gage Street and Aberdeen Street
Dr. Sun Yat-sen Historical Trail Stop: Former Furen Literary Society site, revitalized as Pak Tsz Lane Park.

- J Po Pan Teahouse****
G/F, 90 Staunton Street
Exterior walls finished in traditional Shanghai plaster, with the staircases, interior red brick walls, and patterned floor tiles all preserved.

- K 30 Houses***
Area around Staunton Street and Shing Wong Street
Said to be named after merchant who bought 30 "Tong Lau", a tenement cluster along Staunton Street.

Wing Lee Street*

Post-1950s tenement buildings, known as filming location for Echoes of the Rainbow.

Shing Wong Street Stone Steps

Granite steps with banyan trees in historic walls and community murals.

- 88-90 Staunton Street***
"Tong Lau Experience Room" with vintage household items and preserved architectural features of tenement buildings.

- Community Farm***
16 Wa In Fong East
Recruiting neighborhood volunteers to jointly grow edible plants, ornamental flowers, and specialty herbs.

- L Ladder Street**
Next to Man Mo Temple on Hollywood Road
Built in 1841, preserved its original retaining walls, stone wall trees, and balustrades.

- M Hong Kong News-Expo**
2 Bridges Street
Former Bridges Street Market building, revitalized as a news media exhibition and education centre.

- N PMQ**
35 Aberdeen Street
Former married police dormitory, revitalized as creative hub for local entrepreneurs.

- O 60 Hollywood Road**
Pre-war tenement building with Neoclassical and Art Deco details in balconies, railings, pillars, and cornices.

- P Tai Kwun**
10 Hollywood Road
Declared monument and the former Central Police Station, revitalized as an arts and heritage centre.

Epicure's Table

- 2 Kowloon Soy Co. Ltd.**
9 Graham Street
Century-old soy sauce producer known for traditional sun-fermented soy sauce exported to Europe and America.

- 3 和昌號 (Chinese Only)**
31 Graham Street
Renowned for century eggs, soft with pine patterns and creamy golden yolk.

- 6 Kung Lee Sugarcane Juice**
G/F, 60 Hollywood Road
Time-honored shop with classic HK décor, serving family-recipe sugarcane juice.

- 8 Lan Fong Yuen**
2 Gage Street
Classic cha chaan teng and dai pai dong, renowned for silk-stocking milk tea and yuenyeung.

- 9 Yat Lok Restaurant**
G/F, Kam Wo Building, 34-38 Stanley Street
Family-run Michelin one-star restaurant, known for crispy roast goose by secret family recipe.



City Walls in Colour

- 11 Hing Lung Street Mural**
Exterior walls of Hung Tak Building & Shun On Commercial Building

Two vibrant large murals on local culture and community life in the Central and Western District.

- 12 H6 CONET Indoor Murals**
G/F, The Center, 99 Queen's Road Central

Large-scale indoor murals depicting history of six neighbouring streets.

- 13 Gilman's Bazaar Mural**
Exterior of Wah Yuen Building

3D-effect mural by local artists featuring marbles and gears using perspective and shading.

- 14 Wa On Lane Sitting-out Area Mural**
Aberdeen Street, Wa On Lane

Forest scene in Central inviting urban dwellers to reflect on city ecology within the concrete jungle.

- 15 Staveley Street Mural**
10 Staveley Street

Inspiration from daily park scenes infuses the painting with lively plants and flowers that resonate with the surroundings.

City Walls in Color

- 16 Hollywood Road Mural**
Pop art-style featuring classic Hollywood stars on hotel exterior.



- 17 Graham Street Mural**
Intersection of Graham Street and Hollywood Road
Depicts former Kowloon Walled City with colourful tenement buildings on blue background.



- 18 Staunton Street Mural**
64 Staunton Street
"Woman and Printing Press" by Spanish artist using CMYK colour palette.



- 19 Wa In Fong West Mural**
10 Wa In Fong West
Grayscale woodcut-style on historical printing and daily life.



- 20 Square Street Murals**
Large murals by various street artists, each with distinct themes and styles.



Cinematic Legacy

- 21 Central Market Divergence (2005)**
Suen Siu-yan and assassin Koo unleash a brutal, life-or-death showdown amid the market stalls.

- Hidden Blade (2023)**
Secretary Yip ascends the misty terrazzo staircase in a haunting, fog-shrouded moment of quiet tension.

- 22 Central-Mid-Levels Escalator Chungking Express (1994)**
Faye crouches secretly on the escalator, stealing glances at Cop 663's apartment.

- The Dark Knight (2008)**
Bruce receives Mr. Fox's revolutionary gadget right on the moving escalator.

- 23 Graham Street Chungking Express (1994)**
Faye lingers in the vibrant open-air market, hoping for a fateful glimpse of 663 over his daily meal.

- 24 Gage Street Bodyguards and Assassins (2009)**
Yang Quyun chats with students on the stairs—until an assassin's bullet ends it all in shocking betrayal.

- 25 Wing Lee Street Echoes of the Rainbow (2010)**
The Law family endures hardships with grit and love in these historic tong lau tenements.

Slow-living Space

- 26 Kau U Fong Children's Playground**
3 Kau U Fong
A peaceful green oasis hidden in a quiet alley. Shaded by old trees, with a vibrant and playful mural by French artist.

- 27 Wa On Lane Sitting-Out Area**
Aberdeen Street, Wa On Lane
A tranquil corner in the heart of Central, perfect for a short break, enjoying the scenery, or a relaxed lunch.
